A New Creed (by Reverend Nicole Collins)

(Please be seated)

ALL: St. Paul gave us the 1st creed—Jesus is Lord.
He continues in his letter to the Philippians to say—to the glory of God the Father.
We must daily reflect what Grace means to each and everyone of us
Christ Jesus, our crucified Lord came down to save us.
He took the form of man as we profess in the universal creeds—
That He is fully human and fully Divine
He bore the cross and He rose from the grave defeating sin, death and the devil
He has ascended into heaven, the land of Grace
As children of God aspiring children of Grace and promise
We pledge our lives to live intentionally obedient to the sovereign Lord Jesus

A New Creed II *Inspired by the Nicene Creed; by Reverend Nicole Collins*

ALL: We believe in the Triune God; Creator & Sovereign of all the Earth
And all things visible & invisible—what we may not understand
Father, Son & Holy Spirit
Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the only Son of the Father, incarnate from a virgin
Mary, the Mother of Our Lord—through her He was made man
Fully Human and Fully Divine
Our Lord Jesus bore the cross, as ordered by Pontius Pilate
He truly suffered, died and was buried
Upon the 3rd day's rise according to the Living Word, defeating sin, death & the power of the devil—
Our Lord Jesus resurrected, ascended to heaven & is seated at the right hand of the Father.
The Lord Jesus will return in glory and judgment over both the living & the deceased
We must know deeply in our hearts that His sovereign Kingdom will never end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, its gift of life and transformation
Which proceeds from the Father & the Son
All three, we worship and glorify
The Prophets have foretold and taught us of the Triune sovereignty
We believe in the Sanctified, universal & disciple-centered Church
We acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins & the motivation for our lives to live in Grace

Irenaeus' Rules of Faith *(Please be seated)*

ALL: We Believe in one God, the Father Almighty, who made the heaven and the earth and the seas and all the things that are in them; and in one Christ Jesus, the Son of God, who was made flesh for our salvation; and in the Holy Spirit, who made known through the prophets the plan of salvation, and the coming, and the birth from a virgin, and the passion, and the resurrection from the dead, and the bodily ascension into heaven of the beloved Christ Jesus, our Lord, and his future appearing from heaven in the glory of the Father to sum up all things and to raise anew all flesh of the whole human race.

The Disciple's Creed *(Based on a young Zimbabwe pastor)*

ALL: I'm a part of the fellowship of the unashamed. The die has been cast. I have stepped over the line. The decision has been made. I'm a disciple of His and I won't look back, let up, slow down, back away, or be still. My past is redeemed. My present makes sense. My future is secure. I'm done and finished with low living, sight walking, small planning, smooth knees, colorless dreams, tamed visions, mundane talking, cheap living, and

dwarfed goals. I live by faith, lean on His presence, walk by patience, lift by prayer, and labor by Holy Spirit power. My face is set. My gait is fast. My goal is heaven. My road may be narrow, my way rough, my companions few, but my guide is reliable and my mission is clear. I will not be bought, compromised, detoured, lured away, turned back, deluded or delayed. I will not flinch in the face of sacrifice or hesitate in the presence of the adversary. I will not negotiate at the table of the enemy. I won't give up, shut up, or let up until I have stayed up, stored up, prayed up, paid up, and preached up for the cause of Christ.

I am a disciple of Jesus. I must give until I drop, preach until all know, and work until He comes. And when He does come for His own, He'll have no problems recognizing me. My colors will be clear!

A Lenten Creed *inspired from the monastic order of Saint Simon Cyrene*

ALL: May I indeed deny myself the excesses of this world. Taking only what I need for myself and household. Seeking nothing for my vainglory nor reason to boast. If I boast of anything, as taught by the scriptures, let me boast in the Lord and in him alone.

May I indeed take up my cross. Let me accept the sorrow and suffering that is mine for the sake of others. Let me sacrifice my time and effort for the uplift of the greater good. As with our Lord in the Gethsemane, I cannot deny and must express my sorrow. Nevertheless, I accept the will of God and understand there is a greater necessity and glory in the same and pain that I bear.

May I indeed follow our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ this day. Not for the sake of popularity nor cultural norm. But because I have come to know him for myself. Because I have walked with him and bear witness to his salvation in my life. Therefore, I drop my nets of earthly expectations and leave my tables of society's standards to follow the Good Shepherd wherever he leads me in life.

I am compelled by my love for the Gospel and desire to live in holiness. I am merely a passer-by in this world. There is a greater home that I see to reside in. May my life on this earth inspire and lead others to the true belief and faith in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen

The Old Roman Creed *(early form of the Apostles' Creed)*

ALL: *I believe in God the Father almighty; and in Christ Jesus His only Son, our Lord.*

Who was born from the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary,

Who under Pontius Pilate was crucified, and buried, on the third day rose again from the dead,

ascended to the heaven, sits at the right hand of the Father, whence he will come to judge the living and the dead; and in the Holy Spirit, the holy Church, the remission of sins, the resurrection of the flesh. Amen

The Augsburg Confession; Article III: Of the Son of God *(Please be seated)*

ALL: The Word, that is, the Son of God, did assume the human nature in the womb of the blessed virgin Mary, so that there are two natures, the divine and the human, inseparably enjoined in one Person, one Christ, true God and true man, who was born of the virgin Mary, truly suffered, was crucified, dead, and buried, that He might reconcile the Father unto us, and be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for all actual sins of humans. He also descended into hell, and truly rose again the third day; afterward He ascended into heaven that He might sit on the right hand of the Father, and forever reign and have dominion over all creatures, and sanctify them that believe in Him, by sending the Holy Ghost into their hearts, to rule, comfort, and quicken them, and to defend them against the devil and the power of sin.
